The student answered the question, which surprised the teachers.

In the first sentence it's the <u>question</u> that surprises the teacher, however, in the second one it is <u>the student's answering it</u> surprises the teacher.

- 3. Won't you ever stop talking about **things** which make me nervous? (no)
- 4. Mr. Wallace came up with his students, which was a pleasant surprise. (yes)
- 5. I shut the door on my necktie, which was very stupid of me. (yes)
- 6. Jerry was fired from his work, which surprised all of his co-workers. (yes)
- 7. Did you get the message **which** concerned the special meeting. (no)
- 8. One day you'll learn where you once belonged, which will surely annoy you. (yes)
- 9. We have an apartment **which** overlooks the park. (no)
- 10. Mr. Anderson responded my letter, which I appreciated very much. (yes)
- 11. There was an accident on I-80, which means I'll be late to work this morning. (yes)
- 12. English has an **alphabet** which consists of 26 letters. (no)
